# RENEW New centre for creativity in Old Town

Renew, the new Men in Sheds project for Swindon, which is part of the same charity that runs Swindon Foodbank has now opened a centre of creativity in Victoria Road, Old Town with space for a wealth of home-made gifts, furniture made and upcycled up the 'shedders' and workshops for all ages starting over the next few weeks in upcycling, re-upholstery and other crafts, including cooking.

The project itself aims to relieve social isolation and loneliness, help promote health and well-being and create community. The focus is on men's wellbeing and sharing skills but is open to all. They encourage people from all walks of life and all parts of the community to have a good time together and work on projects for the community and themselves.

The 'shed' hosts their wood workshop in Park South which opens on a Tuesday from 12 - 4pm. The new centre which even features a full size shed inside made by John McKinnon, with a church pew donated by Christchurch – is already proving popular with upholstery courses for the public running 3 times a day on Wednesdays and an upholstery course for the shedders started last week.

They also aim to provide an affordable space and creative outlet for artists and crafters to teach and sell their products and give opportunities for school aged entrepreneurs to learn skills then sell them in the shop.




"We have been overwhelmed by the way the community have come together to open the centre. "We look forward to becoming a centre for creativity and community, a place to pass on skills as well as provide opportunities for people to engage in activities that help people remain, physically, mentally and socially active.
