Nurture Hub Breakfast Service Many thanks to Sue Tredget and everyone who helped to support this initiative. It's something that Lawn Primary School have now ceased - at least, for the foreseeable future - because the initiative has been completely successful! Back in the spring, the school decided to offer free breakfasts, every morning between Monday - Friday in term-time, as part of efforts to carefully bring around half-a-dozen absentee pupils back into lessons. The school staff were going to pay for the free breakfasts out of their own pockets...until our church stepped in. Since then, weekly donations of breakfast things by yourselves have been taken up and it's been instrumental in those children coming back to school.

Food-parcels Many thanks to everyone who has made donations of food and drink, or financial donations, to the church food-parcels. Over thirteen weeks recently, the church has delivered a weekly, balanced, healthy food-parcel to three households referred to us, by Lawn Primary School - along with two or three emergency parcels, as one-offs. This assistance has now helped those three households get themselves back on their feet. We've now had a new family referred to us, but if you know of anyone else who may require some help during this cost-of-living crisis, please see John. Our thanks go to Fiona, Sue and Keith Tredget, Jenny Garth and Christine and Stephen for their help with the deliveries.

Gardening There are a number of individuals in the Lawn area, now known to John, who need help with basic, practical things at home, not least in the garden. Several of you have already expressed a desire to help them. If you're interested in assisting some senior citizens with getting their gardens back into shape - perhaps on a Saturday - please see John. Free tea, coffee and other refreshments guaranteed!

Prayer Walking We have plans to cover the whole area of Lawn, in active prayer - and to bless and engage with the residents in each road, as we go. Will you help? We need volunteers who will pray, and others who will put leaflets through letterboxes, explaining to residents what the church is doing. Please see John if you can.

Flipped: Life in the Vpside Down Kingdom by Malcolm Duncan

This is the book that accompanied the theme of Spring Harvest 2023 - 'Flipped: Life in the Upside-Down Kingdom'. The upside-down kingdom being the Kingdom of God. Which fits in really nicely with it being the year of the Coronation of King Charles III - and the earthly United Kingdom.

Malcolm Duncan is a regular speaker at Spring Harvest, as well as being an Elim pastor. Here he introduces the idea of God's Kingdom being 'flipped' around from worldly kingdoms and dominions. Malcolm Duncan narrates this through the Beatitudes as found in Matthew's Gospel. So, the whole notion of the first will be last and the last will be first is central to this book. Though he does sometimes use the phrases 'the Kingdom of Heaven' and 'the Kingdom of God' interchangeably as he digs through the meanings of God's Kingdom in Matthew. In the introductory chapters, Malcolm Duncan takes us through Kingdom theology in an easy reading and informative way, demonstrating that he writes in a way that is inclusive for many - you don't need a theology degree to understand the gist of the position he writes from (Malcolm Duncan is Spring Harvest's 'theologian in residence').

The book is layered in ideas of the Kingdom of God - beginning with looking at the kingly attributes of Jesus and exploring the Old Testament prophets writing on the coming King, and also the Gospel narrative of the King of Kings (especially in Matthew, where the Gospel is written with a Jewish audience in mind, and tells that Jesus is the Messiah). Malcolm Duncan then takes the reader to ponder on being a person of the Kingdom. In this section of the book, there are some good inspirational stories from across the world of people who have begun to embody what it is to live in the Kingdom of God above other kingdoms and dominions. We are reminded of the Sermon on the Mount and what it is to act on Jesus' teachings today. A further chapter discusses the purpose of God's Kingdom - which in a time where parts of the UK church are enveloped in varying degrees of safeguarding concerns, Malcolm Duncan reminds us that the purpose is to point people to Jesus, rather than to become Jesus. The reader is challenged to look at the perspective - the angle - of God's Kingdom through the Beatitudes. There are challenges of looking at a fuller meaning of love, grace and freedom in Christ and how these can be antithesis of what the world sees in love, grace and freedom amongst other things. Finally, the reader is reminded that we can continue to receive the promise of God's Kingdom here on earth, and points the way to the first Apostles in Acts and the 'flipped' way of life that they took on, through the power of King Jesus who reigns in heaven and on earth.

This is an accessible read, with opportunities to pray at the end of each chapter (it's partly designed for reading in small groups). There are some good case studies from near and far (including from the time that Malcolm was minister at Gold Hill Baptist Church in Chalfont).

A book for ordinary people to learn how to live in an extraordinary Kingdom.

Soaking Prayer Meeting

A few years ago, in Lawn Community Church some Thursday evening prayer meetings were held in a style of 'soaking' prayer meetings. This gave an opportunity to spend quality time with the Lord, listening and receiving. We were encouraged to make ourselves as comfortable as possible for the sessions, to lie down if we wished - to take appropriate things to make this comfortable such as cushions, padding to lie on, exercise mat, pillow, a blanket to keep warm in cooler months. A lot of people opted to lie down, while others remained seated. We listened to a meditation and scripture at the start, then a period of quiet followed sometimes with music to listen to the Lord. Sometimes people were refreshed by sleep. In these meetings people received words, pictures, peace, a sense of being released and blessed by the Lord. Following the quiet time, we shared what happened if we chose to. The meetings started with five people: Susan & Keith S, Rachel, Frank & Ruth attending regularly, whom found them beneficial and inspiring. Over the months more people started regularly attending, who also found these Soaking Prayer meetings, special times. It became a valued opportunity to be refreshed by the Lord.
